



## Fix a bike

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Need a repair? **Learn to do-it-yourself during our DIY hours!** Just walk in with your bike during Open Shop hours. You'll be assigned to a repair station, and volunteer mechanics will help you diagnose and repair your bike, using our professional tools, supplies, stand, and access to used parts. Pay \$3/hr for the shop time, plus any parts you might need.

## Take a class

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**We periodically offer classes that will train you to perform the most common repairs and adjustments.** This is a great way to jump start your participation as a volunteer mechanic in our shop helping others fix their bikes. Additionally, private classes for groups of 6-14 people, which can be a great way to have some fun with your friends while learning how to have more fun with your bikes!

## Buy a bike

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**We offer donated bikes for sale to the community to raise funds for the shop and programs and provide affordable transportation.** Bikes include road bikes, cruisers, city bikes, mountain bikes, and kids bikes. Bikes are in varying condition and sold as-is, but of course we have facilities and know-how for any needed repairs. Bikes are generally priced between \$50 and \$400, with the majority of rideable bikes in the \$75-\$125 range.

## Donate a bike

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**Rather than let your unused bikes take up space or end up in a landfill, let us refurbish them for a new life on the streets of Newark!** Depending on the condition, volunteer mechanics will either strip it down for parts to be used on other bikes, or we'll refurbish it to working condition. Due to space limitations, we are currently accepting adult bicycles in fixable condition, as well as bicycle parts. ## Free bike program

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The **Free Bike Voucher Program** supplies a bicycle and needed repairs at no cost for those who need a bicycle for transportation to work, services or groceries, or for exercise and to maintain a healthy lifestyle. Apply by filling in the Application Form and a letter of referral from a local social service agency or community organization. ## Youth program

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The **Youth Empowerment Program** is aimed at area youth ages 10 to 15. Meeting six Saturday afternoons each session, youth participate in community service and bike related activities with a focus on character development. A focus on service-learning activities as an interactive group of allow the youth to explore the value of community within Newark and beyond.

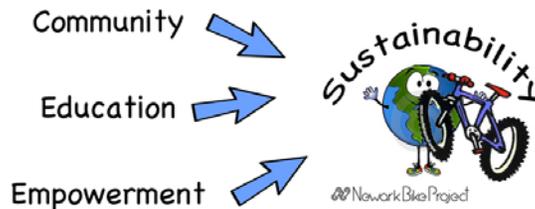
## Volunteer!
